Time Allocation:

Each class up to third year (inclusive) have one class period per week in C.S.P.E.

This could be of 35 or 40 minutes duration depending on the class time (period)

Options Structure:

Every First, Second and Third year student must study / take part in C.S.P.E. – it is compulsory in St. Nathy's.

Timetabling:

One class period per week for every First Second and Third year student.

There are approx 12 C.S.P.E. classes in the week

Grouping of Pupils (Mixed ability, Streaming):

Pupils are grouped on a mixed ability basis

Pupils are then “loosely” streamed in Second and Third Year.

Student Access to Subject / Level:

All students have access to C.S.P.E. up to Junior Cert. and then sit a common level paper in Junior Cert.

Class Organisation:

Classrooms are arranged on a traditional / normal basis. However when students are engaged in discussion and project work – seating is arranged more informal to facilitate learning process.
