SCHOOL DAY

The school day begins with tutor time and roll call. Students are at school from 08:57 - 15:55 Monday - Thursday and 08:57 - 13:30 on Friday. The Canteen provides a variety of hot and cold food for morning break and lunchtime and also accommodates those students who wish to bring a packed lunch.

OFFICE

UNIFORM

The school uniform promotes a sense of belonging to the school community and is a visual symbol of St. Nathy's College. All students wear the school uniform during the school day and when participating in a school organised events. It is essential that students maintain a high standard of personal appearance when wearing the school uniform in accordance with the Code of Behaviour.

Boys' Uniform: navy blue trousers, light grey shirt, blue crested jumper, fully black footwear with black laces, black/navy socks and navy crested jacket.

Girls' Uniform: knee length school kilt/navy blue trousers, blue crested jumper, light grey shirt, fully black footwear with black laces, black/navy socks and a navy crested jacket. Black tights must be worn with the school kilt.

Footwear: Appropriate footwear must be fully black with black laces. Sports shoes must only be worn during PE and/or sport activities.

Head Dress: Head dress is permissible where deemed appropriate. The hijab worn by students must be plain navy in colour and of shoulder length.

School Jacket: A crested College jacket is available. No other jackets and/or hoodies are permitted to be worn inside the school building or on the school premises.



BOOK RENTAL

The College operates a book rental scheme for all Junior Cycle students for an annual fee. The book rental scheme provides students with all relevant textbooks and workbooks for the three years of Junior Cycle in a cost effective manner. An application form and further details regarding the book rental scheme will be available from the school office following enrolment.

PASTORAL CARE

Pastoral Care in St Nathy's College has at its centre the recognition of the uniqueness of each student. We aim to create a safe and caring environment where each student is valued and supported to achieve their full potential. The welfare of each individual student is paramount and we promote the full academic and personal development of our students within a Christian environment. As a Catholic school, we aim to live by the gospel values of love, respect, honesty and justice.

Our approach to Pastoral Care ensures that every student is known as an individual and given every opportunity to flourish and develop. Each student within the community of St Nathy's has a Tutor and a Year Head. Students meet with their Tutor each morning. This provides an excellent opportunity for regular group discussion where students talk about relevant issues which support their wellbeing. Tutor time also provides a safe space for a student to discuss issues or concerns that they may be experiencing with a member of staff.



GUIDANCE

The guidance department at St Nathy's College views the development of positive self-esteem as essential for students. The department works with all year groups and is involved in classroom activities, one to one guidance where students are provided with a safe space to discuss personal issues in addition to subject choice and subject levels.



STUDENT LEADERSHIP

MAKING A POSITIVE CONTRIBUTION

St. Nathy's provides opportunities for students to develop their understanding of social issues, to engage with the reality of the world and to make positive contributions to the lives of others especially those in need. We encourage our students to grow in their awareness of their duty and responsibility towards others, to gain the skills to articulate their thoughts and to become responsible and compassionate members of society.

MENTORING

The transition from primary to secondary school is exciting but can be challenging. Therefore, St. Nathy's has a mentoring system in place for First Year students. Mentors are Leaving Cert students. A mentor supports a First Year student who transfers to St. Nathy's from the primary school where both the mentor and First Year attended. Young people relate exceptionally well to their peers and in this capacity the mentors provide a seamless transition to St. Nathy's for First Years. By meeting with the First Year student regularly, the mentors help to address any issues or concerns new students may be experiencing.



STUDENT COUNCIL

A Student Council is elected in each school year consisting of students from each year group. The Student Council meets regularly to discuss issues and promote student initiatives. In this way, students are provided with numerous opportunities to develop leadership skills at all levels during their years in St. Nathy's.

SUPERVISED EVENING STUDY

The College provides facilities for supervised study from Monday -Thursday from 4:15 pm - 6:15pm

SPORT

The sport facilities and resources include extensive playing fields, an all-weather astro pitch, two basketball courts, an indoor sports complex with changing facilities. JUNIOR CYCLE

St. Nathy's College offers a broad range of subject choice for Junior Cycle. At Junior Cycle, students are taught through a broad and balanced curriculum which allows students to develop skills and knowledge across a wide range of subjects. Underpinning the new Junior Cycle are a set of principles, key skills and statements of learning. The new Junior Cycle places the student at the centre of the learning process. It allows for new ways of learning and a broader range of skills to properly assessed.

JUNIOR CYCLE SUBJECTS

TRANSITION YEAR

Transition Year is a one year programme between Junior Cycle and Senior Cycle. Transition Year offers students the opportunity to mature and develop through a broad variety of learning experiences inside and outside the classroom. Along with formal academic studies, TY students undertake work experience and social awareness placements, community outreach, educational trips, cultural experiences, trips to European destinations and visits by guest speakers.

Each year TY students are involved in supporting the work of the local branch of the St. Vincent de Paul and an annual stage production.

LCVP

The LCVP is an enhanced Leaving Certificate Programme consisting of the following link modules, Enterprise Education, Preparation for Work and Work Experience. The LCVP combines the academic strengths of the traditional Leaving Certificate with a focus on self-directed learning, innovation and enterprise.

SENIOR CYCLE

LEAVING CERTIFICATE

Leaving Certificate students follow a two year programme leading to the Leaving Certificate Examination. St. Nathy's College offers three programmes of study in preparation for the Leaving Cert. These programmes are:

- Traditional Leaving Cert
- Leaving Cert Vocational Programme (LCVP)
- Leaving Cert Applied (LCA)

TRADITIONAL LEAVING CERTIFICATE

Students study 7 subjects for the Leaving Cert. In addition to the core subjects of Irish, English and Maths students must study an additional four subjects. Students can study all subjects at higher or ordinary level.

St. Nathy's provides 19 subjects for students to chose from.

LEAVING CERTIFICATE APPLIED (LCA)

The Leaving Certificate Applied is a distinct, self-contained two-year Senior Cycle programme aimed at preparing students for adult and working life. This programme is designed to meet the needs of students who are not adequately catered for by the other Leaving Certificate programmes. Grades are allocated on a continuous assessment basis over the two years of the programme with practical's/interviews and final written papers among the different forms of assessment used. Students who complete the LCA have various options for progression to further and higher education.
